RBI December 2024 MPC Meeting: Key Updates on Monetary Policy

- CRR Adjustment: The Cash Reserve Ratio (CRR) was reduced by 50 basis points to 4%.

- Marginal Standing Facility (MSF): The MSF rate remained steady at 6.75%.

Key Monetary Terms Simplified

- Cash Reserve Ratio (CRR): The percentage of a bank's deposits required to be kept as reserves with the central bank, ensuring liquidity in the banking system.
- Repo Rate: The interest rate at which the central bank lends money to commercial banks, influencing the cost of borrowing in the economy.
- Standing Deposit Facility (SDF): A mechanism where banks can deposit their surplus funds with the central bank without collateral, aiding liquidity management.
- Marginal Standing Facility (MSF): An emergency borrowing tool for banks to obtain overnight funds from the central bank at a rate higher than the repo rate.
- MIBOR (Mumbai Interbank Offered Rate): A benchmark interest rate reflecting the cost of interbank borrowing in the Indian short-term market.




